

Author Interview

1.) When did you realize you wanted to be a writer?

My dream of writing goes back 34 years. I first thought about it in college when I wrote my Master's thesis on "how to publish a children's book." I knew that the title would be "Oodles and Oodles of Noodles," and that it would be about a little kid who loves noodles. I set it aside as I taught kindergarten, raised my four sons and had a daycare home for teacher's kids.

One day, my third son asked me if I ever thought about finally writing my book. In my mind, I heard, "Write your book already!" So, I did!

2.) What inspired you to write this book?

Children inspired me to write my book. I love how they find joy in the simplest things. They use their imagination to enter into fabulous places and wonderful adventures. I love looking at the world through their eyes and finding the magic. As a writer, I wanted to use my imagination to touch the hearts of children around the world.

3.) What will children learn from your book?

Children will learn to use their imagination, and the importance of laughter and being silly. I think this is something we all need now, more than ever. I want kids to know that reading is fun! My book also increases their vocabulary by introducing 18 "big" noodle words. The rhyme and repetition throughout the book help children identify and manipulate sounds.

4.) What was the most surprising thing you learned about writing a book?

The most surprising thing I learned about writing a book is that I would now not only be a writer, but an author, that I would feel a part of the writing community and that the new friends I would make would support me throughout this new journey and root for me.

It also was surprising to learn how much is involved in self-publishing a book. You, the author, do everything! It's up to **you** to find your editor, illustrator and printer. The hardest part for me is marketing. It's learning how to get my book into the hands of children all around the world.

5.) What do you love most about the writing process?

What I love most about the writing process is the creativity! I look at everything in a new way, with new eyes. Ideas are everywhere! How the littlest thing--like a noodle--can become a story full of imagination is pure magic!

But the biggest gift of all is watching children enjoy my book.
